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Launching of Agape Association of Bible Schools

In January, '04, we began a new ministry called the Agape Association of Bible Schools (AABS). AABS centers around the launching and maintaining of independently operated Bible Schools at the local level called Church Based Bible Schools (CBBS). Our goal is to have CBBSs in affiliation with us from all ten regions of Ghana and beyond!

In April, '04, we presented AABS during AGM's "Crosswalk" Leadership Seminar. Many pastors were excited about this new ministry!

*C*urrently 19 ministries have affiliated with AABS, representing 6 regions of Ghana, Liberia, Benin and Nigeria. From these CBBSs, more trained leaders can be sent out to evangelize, plant churches, and penetrate the unreached peoples of Ghana and surrounding countries.

The Agape Association of Bible Schools exists to empower the local church in West Africa through helping to establish independently operated Bible schools, providing Biblical teaching resources, and encouraging pastors and leaders.

4 Basic Truths of Effective Communication

Excerpts from John Maxwell "The 21 Indispensable Qualities of a Leader"

1. Simplify Your Message

Communication is not just what you say. It's also how you say it. Forget about impressing people with big words or complex sentences. If you want to connect with people keep it simple.

2. See the Person

As you communicate with people, ask yourself these questions: Who is my audience? What are their questions? What needs to be accomplished? And how much time do I have?

3. Show the Truth

Credibility precedes great communication. First, believe in what you say. Second, live what you say.

4. Seek a Response

Every time you speak to people, give them something to feel, something to remember, and something to do.
